→ The Columbia Journalism Review was founded in 1961 under the auspices of the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism and is based at the school on the Morningside Heights campus.

→ It was established “To assess the performance of journalism...to help stimulate continuing improvement in the profession, and to speak out for what is right, fair and decent.” Then, as now, the task was to encourage excellence in journalism in the service of a free society.

→ The print magazine is published six times a year: January/February, March/April, May/June, July/August, September/October, and November/December. Its Web site, CJR.org, publishes fresh content every day, via five online desks: politics (Campaign Desk); business (The Audit); science, health, and the environment (The Observatory); news innovation (The News Frontier); and media news and criticism (Behind the News).

→ CJR’s chairman is Victor Navasky; vice-chairman, Peter Osnos; deputy publisher, Dennis Giza; and director of strategic initiatives, Janine Jaquet.

→ CJR’s executive editor is Mike Hoyt; managing editor/print, Brent Cunningham; managing editor/Web, Justin Peters.

→ Readers of the print magazine are those interested in the quality and the future of news, including journalism professionals. Our print circulation is about 18,000. Monthly average unique visitors to the Web site are 165,000.
